Chesterfield Motorfest 2019

Chesterfield Motor Fest rolled back into town on August 18th! With lots of vehicles visiting there was something for every car enthusiast to take a look at including vehicles from every decade, American classics, super cars, buses, minis, MX5s, 4 wheel drives and a variety of motorsport cars along with a range of scooters and bikes. A trophy presentation for show winners added to what promised to be a fantastic day for car enthusiasts and visitors alike. Mid Derbyshire were given a prominent position and put on a great display. Chesterfield has rarely been so busy and the whole show took at least a couple of hours to look around. Dennis Cooke and Kev Bell both won "Best in show" awards for their Saxo and 205 respectively. In addition to our winners, Drew Staton, Lee Burgess and Tom Henman represented MDMC. Someone did suggest that the real star of the show was an entirely original escort RS1800 – the original press car. This show would appear to be a "must do" for 2020.









Closed road rallying

Closed road rallying continues to gather momentum following its relatively recent introduction to our roads. Some traditional closed road events are returning to the calendar with the Beatson's Building Supplies Mull Rally running from 11th-13th October. The Jim Clark Rally will run in Berwickshire/the Borders area on 8th-9th November.

Clacton has seen the Corbeau seats rally running since April 2018. Next year it will be part of the BRC and includes a night stage on the Saturday using the Clacton sea front. It will run on 25th-26th April 2020.

The North West stages will have its 2nd closed road event next year. It is schedules to run over the weekend of 20th -21st March. Legend Fires will continue its sponsorship which has been on-going for the last 16 years. The event will be 100% on closed roads next year with visits to Weeton disappearing from the plans. There will be new stages and some of the 2019 stages will be reversed.

It was unfortunate that two of the newer events had to run on the same weekend at the start of September. The Hill Ford Three Shires stages took place on 7th September. This event was based at the Eastnor Deer Park close to the town of Ledbury with 6 stages spread across three counties. 5 were on Closed Public Roads and 1 was on the tarmac roads within the Eastnor Deer Park. The 18 stages traversed the Gloucestershire, Herefordshire and Worcestershire. 120 cars started the event which had 48 competitive miles.

The Get Connected Rali Bae Ceredigion also had room for 120 cars competing over 43 stage miles with 8 stages. This event ran some of the longest stages seen on the new closed road events. Stage 2 and 8, Nant y Moch, was a rally challenging 10 miles. The organisation was superb with first class facilities provided for its base at Aberystwyth University. Car parking and accommodation was plentiful. This event used some of the finest rally roads using sections previously seen on some famous Welsh road rallies. Competitors said they compared favourably to Irish events.

Is it only a matter of time before the BRC becomes entirely closed roads on the UK mainland? Will we see crews from overseas coming to compete on our roads rather than British crews going abroad?

Twyford autotest/PCA

Following the Targa there will bea PCA/Autotest on Sunday 2oth October. The event will be requiring support further from **MDMC** members to marshal on the Sunday. Entries are available online. It will use the smoother parts of Twyford around the crossroads. This will round off what promises to be a great weekend!

Winter Championship Series Rules

Announcement

Mid-Derbyshire Motor Club Ltd will promote a Winter Championship Series from September the through to April following year. Championship "Winter The will called the Championship". be

Title and Jurisdiction

The Mid-Derbyshire Motor Club Ltd 20xx-yy "Winter Championship" is organised and administered by Mid-Derbyshire Motor Club Ltd (referred to as MDMC) in accordance with these Championship Regulations.

Officials

Championship Secretary: TBA

Eligibility

Entrants must be in possession of a valid Club Membership Card. All vehicles must comply with the current Motorsport UK road rally regulations and all Supplementary Regulations issued for individual rounds.

Invited

All members of a Motor Club that is in the East Midlands Association of Motor Clubs are invited to compete on MDMC Winter Championship Rounds, but must be a current fully paid- up member of Mid-Derbyshire MC to score points. Current Club cards must be shown at signing-on.

Registration

Registration is free to all fully paid-up members of Mid-Derbyshire Motor Club.

Championship Rounds

The Winter Championship will comprise of no more than 7 events, a combination of 12 car, navigational scatter rallies and table top. There will be a maximum of one round per calendar month, between September and April.

Competitors who do not finish will be awarded 1 point.

Organisers (who are also registered for the Championship) will be awarded 15 points for the first event they organise in the Winter Championship and 12 points should they organise a second event.

Marshals (who are also registered for the Championship) will be awarded 12 points for marshalling, but may only count this score for two events. Organisers may also Marshal on Championship Rounds but can only count a maximum of two scores (from their combined organising/marshalling efforts) towards their score

total.

An organising team may comprise of a maximum of two Championship registered competitors. To be eligible to score points the competitor must compete on a least one event.

3	rounds	-	best	2	to	count

Any less than 3 rounds, the Championship will be declared null and void.

Classes

Competitors will compete in four classes, using the following criteria:

Class 1 (Beginners): Competitors having not competed on more than three 12-

and navigational scatters. cars or Class 2 (Novice): Competitors having not finished in the Top 20 on a 'National Road Rally. Class 3 (Semi-Expert): Competitors having finished in the Top 20 (but not in the 10) 'National B' Road Top on а Rally. Class 4 (Expert): Competitors having finished within the Top 10 on a 'National B' Road Rally.

Classes will be applied only to a Competitor's chosen discipline. For example, an 'Expert' driver (who has finished in the Top 10 on a 'National B' Road Rally solely as a driver) may enter as a Class 2 Novice Navigator if he / she has not finished in the Top 20 on a 'National B' Road Rally as a navigator.

A competitor's class will be determined by results up to and including August at the start of the championship for that year. Once a competitor registers for the Winter Championship Series, they shall remain in that class for the duration of the Championship, irrespective of any subsequent results obtained whilst competing on 'National B' Road Rallies.

Results

Championship results will be published on the MDMC Website and Forum, and / or by magazine / club newsletter, as soon as possible after each round. Copies of intermediate results may also be obtained by contacting the Championship Secretary.

After the final round of the Winter Series, the onus is on the competitors to point out any discrepancies with the Championship results (by email or in writing) to the Championship Secretary within 7 days of the Championship results being declared 'Provisional'. Should no queries be received within this time, the Championship results will be declared 'Final'. The Championship Secretary will endeavour to publish Provisional results within 14 day of the final round of the series.

In the event of a tie, a 'tie-breaker' decider will be applied: firstly by the greatest number of '15 point' scores, then if still not resolved, by the greatest number of '12 point' scores, '11 point' scores....and so on until a 'winner' is established. In the event there is still a tie, the competitor with the least 'pre-Winter Championship Series' driving / navigating experience will be declared the

'winner'. The Championship Secretary will adjudicate on this 'ultimate' tiehis breaker decider and her decision will be final. NB: Engine capacity cannot be used as a tie-breaker for the final Championship results, as a driver may use different cars during the series and a navigator may different drivers....and doesn't navigate for have an engine CC!

If there is a conflict of interest, then 3 non-affected committee members will make the decision.

Awards

The awards will be presented at the Mid-Derbyshire Motor Club 'Awards Presentation Evening' to be held at a date 'to be announced', and will be allocated as follows:

1st overalldrive1st overnavigator

1st drive each class (ie individual awards) in 4 1st navigator in individual each class (ie 4 awards)

Best 'All rounder'. (All Registered championship competitors are automatically considered for this awards, irrespective of class, but subject to having organised or marshalled on a least one event.

No competitor may win more than one award with the exception of the 'all rounder' cup.

To be eligible for an award the competitor must compete on at least one event.

Judicial

Mid-Derbyshire Motor Club is run for the benefit of its friendly, enthusiastic and 'amateur' members. With this in mind, no protests will be entered into. The Championship Secretary's decision will be final in all arising. If there is a conflict of interest, then 3 non-affected committee members will make the decision.

MDMC 70th Anniversary
